These competitions are sanctioned as a Silver competition of Equestrian Canada (EC) [% of House of Sport, 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, K1H 7X7] and is governed by the rules of EC (A602.1).

An EC Silver (or higher) Membership, and Ontario Equestrian (OE) membership are required for the rider. Fees should be paid to EC – <u>www.equestrian.ca</u> and OE - <u>https://ontarioequestrian.ca/membership/</u> - respectively. Horses must also have an Equestrian Canada horse recording.

Riders do not have to be members of CADORA-Ontario to compete however nonmembers are not eligible for year-end awards nor the Team Competition.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

EC supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All participants shall be bound by the Horse Welfare Code of Conduct.

EC is committed to:

a) upholding the welfare of the horse, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities;

b) requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to maltreatment;

c) ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;

d) providing for the continuous wellbeing of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety;

e) continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;

f) requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and,

g) reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

Equestrian Canada General Rules & Regulations

Every class offered herein, which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book (A602.2). All questions not covered by these rules shall be decided by the show management, whose decision will be final.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition (A602.7).

When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments (A602.9).

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location (A602.5).

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competition must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1 & 4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 day grace period) of the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of the Competition Management. Competition Management may request supporting documentation confirming horse's compliance with mandatory vaccination requirements". See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations

A protest at an EC sanctioned competition other than those specific matters covered in division rules must comply with the following provisions: a) a protest is eligible only if made by an officiating judge, and owner, lessee, trainer, coach competitor or authorized agent, in the division in which the question arises; b) a protest must be made in writing and addressed to the Show Secretary; c) must be signed; and d) must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 in cash. For full details see rule A1204 Gen. Regulations.





OUR COMMITTMENT TO SAFER, More inclusive equestrian sport

Whether you are an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, EC Sport Licence holders play a key role in ensuring the safety and wellness of equestrian sport.

EC SPORT LICENCE HOLDERS

Effective 2022, all EC Sport Licence holders must complete two (2) EC-recognized Safe Sport training modules: Fostering Healthy Equestrian Environments & Concussion Management

- Access these e-learning modules through ECampus at no cost as an EC Sport Licence holder.
- Certificates of completion are valid for three (3) years.

Those who do not complete Safe Sport training within 30 days of EC Sport Licence purchase or renewal are listed as "Not in Good Standing" and ineligible to participate in EC events/activities until training is completed.

Check your Safe Sport training status by logging into MyEC and clicking on the ECampus button.

EC COACHES

NEW in 2023 Effective July 1, 2023, all Canadians who coach athletes at EC-sanctioned events must meet minimum EC Coach Status requirements:

- EC Bronze & Silver events = EC Registered Coach (minimum)
- EC Gold & Platinum events = EC Licensed Coach

Coaches may apply for **Temporary Coach Status** (TCS) at EC-sanctioned events through until the end of 2025. TCS is valid for one (1) EC-sanctioned event only. Applicants must complete an affidavit and pay the associated fee at each event where TCS is requested.

Athletes may declare themselves as **Self-Coached** if they do not have an identified coach at a given EC-sanctioned event. Self-Coached athletes enter their own name and EC Sport Licence number where coaching information is required on entry forms.

IMPORTANT REMINDER: "When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance." EC Rules, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

Biosecurity

In order to keep you and your horse(s) safe at the competitions please observe the following:

Horses must have proof of negative Coggins (within the last 6 months) & must have been administered with EHV 1 & 4 and Equine Influenza vaccines within 6 months but more than 7 days before the show date (EC A519). Entries will be refused failing to meet this requirement.

Please ensure that you have copies of Coggins and vaccinations with you on the day of championships just in case you are asked to provide them.

In making an entry at this show, each owner/trainer attests that, to their best of their knowledge, competing horse(s) under their care have not been in contact with any other horses (away or at their home facility) exhibiting symptoms or signs of illness within the last 14 days. They also agree to share knowledge of any sick or horse displaying symptoms of illness to show management immediately caledondressage@gmail.com or b.westar@gmail.com.

As well:

- Stall Labels must be completed for each horse, including the horse name and 24- hour emergency contact information, and place on the horse's stall door.
- You must check your horse's temperature twice a day and record it on the Horse Temperature Chart. A normal horse temperature is between 37.2-38.3 C. Any temperature over 38.8 C (102 F) must be reported to the horse show office and/or horse show veterinarian.
- Do not share feed/water containers or buckets between horses and do not use communal water troughs. While filling a bucket, do not let the hose end touch the bucket or the water in a bucket.
- Sharing tack and equipment puts horses at risk and is not recommended. If tack/equipment must be used by multiple horses, be sure to clean/disinfect it between uses by different horses.
- Observe good hygiene around all horses on the grounds, and especially after handling a teammate's horse prior to touching your horse.
- Wash hands immediately with soap and water, or use disinfectant hand solution after handling horses, especially after contact with the mouth, nose or feces.
- Please use hand sanitizers and indicate the importance of their use to your friends, family and casual visitors.
- All stalls have been cleaned of all manure and bedding. Feel free to sanitize your assigned stall prior to bringing your horse in.
- Do not allow nose-to-nose contact between horses.
- Do not permit your horse to lick or sniff surfaces in common areas. If this does occur, please use a disinfectant wipe on the area.
- If sharing a wheelbarrow, please do not bring it into your horse's stall. Leave it in the aisle.
- Please dispose of manure in designated areas only. Do not put trash in manure pile.
- If your horse develops a fever or signs of illness, contact the show veterinarian or steward immediately.
- Following the competition, it is recommended that all horses be isolated at their home facility for 21 days prior to reintroduction to other horses. If this is not possible, be sure to observe all horses carefully for 21 days.
- Following the competition, all horses should have temperatures taken twice a day for four days, and be observed for abnormal behavior and signs of cough, nasal discharge, discomfort or lameness.

<u>Competition Numbers</u>: Riders are required to bring their own re-usable bridle/saddle numbers. A limited number of re-usable numbers will be available for purchase from the organizing committee upon arrival at the security gate.

<u>Dogs</u> MUST be kept on a leash no longer than 6 feet at all times while on the property. Dogs must not be loose in the stabling area and must remain on a leash or in a tack stall for bio safety reasons. There will be a \$100 fee for any disruption to competition caused by a loose dog.

Horses temperatures to be taken $2 \times day$.

<u>Stabling</u>

At Caledon, stabling is \$120 for the weekend + \$50 cleaning fee [if required] plus HST. Shavings can be prepurchased for \$12/bag plus HST. All Stalls must be cleaned out before leaving the property. The \$50 cleaning fee will be refunded upon verification that the stall has been cleaned at the end of the competition. Please bring your own feed, hay and water buckets.

Each horse stabled must have a stall card with the following information: competition #, horse show name, rider name & telephone number (if a junior then the person responsible), temperature chart and the list of essential personel connected to the entry. A template can be found <u>here</u>.

Competitors are responsible for any damage done to Westar Farms property or equipment, by them or their entered horse(s), while on the show grounds.

All classes will be held in a 20x60 ring.

All competitors, regardless of age or level of competition must wearly properly fited and fastened approved protective head gear at all times when mounted at any EC Sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location (A905).

**Adult Amateur Riders ** Must have an Amateur Status on their Equestrian Canada membership card otherwise they will be listed as an OPEN Rider.

Competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times.

RIDE TIMES will be posted on Compete Easy Thursday evening for the Western Championships Wednesday evening for the Eastern Championhips.

Be sure to confirm the morning of the Championships in case there are changes.

Entries & Fees

- Entries must be signed by the Person Responsible (A801.5) who must be an EC Sport License holder (A801.6). According to A213.2, parents and guardians must sign the entry form of a minor child/junior competitor; parents/guardians do not have to be EC Sport License holders. Note, however, that the horse owner must hold a valid EC Sport License.
 Please see page 4 of this prize list for more information on the PERSON RESPONSIBLE.
- ii Payment will be made online in accordance with each show directive.
- iii Incomplete entries will not be accepted by Compete Easy, therefore, please ensure that you fill out all fields and attach all required documents.
- iv Competitors on the <u>EC Not in Good Standing List</u> or the <u>EC Medical Suspension List</u> (Article 101 Section A, General Regulations) will be refused entries to the championships.
- Entries for the show will be processed in order that they are received. The organizing committee reserves the right to limit or refuse entries subject to championships rules limiting a competitor's right to refuse entries A805.
- vi Competitors may enter either the Eastern Division or the Western Division, but not both.
- vii Competitors **may not** enter a freestyle class without entering the technical test classes at the same level and in the same division.

PLEASE NOTE: Add-On classes will NOT be offered at either Division of the Championships.

First Aid services will be available on site at both divisions through contracted paramedical representatives. If there is an Emergency please contact the Show Organizer so that we can ensure access and care as required. An emergency plan with all relevant phone numbers will be available with Show Secretary of each show.

On Call Veterinary and Farrier services will be available at both shows. Please go through Show Secretaries.

Rules Pertaining to Championships

This competition is a Championship, please refer to the <u>2023 Rules</u>, Section E Article 7.24 through 7.30 that relate to CHAMPIONSHIP competitions ONLY.

Please note the following rules which are specific to Championships:

- ARTICLE E 7.11.12 SCHOOLING OF HORSES/PONIES
 - 3. At Silver and Gold Championships, schooling of horses/ponies may be done only by the competing athlete from his/her arrival on the show grounds until his/her last class ridden, under penalty of elimination. A groom mounted in the saddle may walk the horse/pony on a long rein. Note: for Para Equestrians riding PE tests see Chapter 6 Para Equestrian.
- ARTICLE E 9.1 CALLING TESTS

All EC tests Introductory through Fourth inclusive may be called during the competition **except** for championship classes at Gold and Silver Championships when all tests must be ridden from memory

• ARTICLE E 9.5 ELIMINATION FROM A CLASS

An entry shall be eliminated under the following circumstances:

Carrying a whip into the competition arena at any EC Championship. Riders may drop the whip before entering the competition arena at the letter A.

General Rules

- Every class offered is covered by the rules and specifications of the 2023 EC rules and will be held and judged in accordance with these rules. Competitors are responsible for knowing these rules. <u>General Rules</u> and <u>Dressage & Para Dressage Rules</u>.
- 2. The show committees reserve the right to govern all conditions of the show.
- 3. Judges' and Stewards' decisions are final.
- 5. Neither Caledon Dressage, CADORA-Ontario, the show committees, nor the facilities (Westar Farms and the Caledon Equestrian Park) will be held responsible for any damage, injury or loss to persons, animals, vehicles, trailers or other property of exhibitors or spectators.
- 6, From the moment the horse arrives on the show grounds, all EC rules and regulations apply.
- 7. In accordance with Dressage Rule E.7.28, all levels will be offered as categories (except where indicated) of Open, Junior and Amateur.
- 8. A current valid Horse Recording number must be provided with the entry before competition numbers will be issued and the horse is allowed to compete.
- 9. Competition numbers must be worn at all times that the horse is out of its stall or trailer.
- 10. No one other than the competing rider may school the horse from the moment it arrives on the show grounds to the end of the last class ridden.

General Rules continued

11. All athletes, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location.

Note: At the tack check which follows the test, the steward may ask the rider to dismount so that the helmet may be inspected for the above approved standards. Article E 4.0

- 12. Horses may be entered in up to 4 classes per day per horse/rider combination at Intro, Training and 1st levels, and 3 classes per day at any other level, if time and entries permit. Article E.7.11.9
- 13. Horses may compete with two different riders at two consecutive levels if each horse/rider combination has qualified at the appropriate level.
- 14. Horse/Rider combinations may compete at two consecutive levels but in only one freestyle level.
- 15. All riders must report to the Steward immediately following their tests for a tack check. Failing to report will result in elimination from that class. Article E. 4.16
- 16. Any horse on the show grounds is subject to random drug testing. Failure to comply will result in elimination from competition and disciplinary action from EC.
- 17. All freestyle music must be provided via email prior to the show. Only digital copies are accepted and must be provided electronically.
- 18. Stabling is to be arranged as per each division's instructions. See pages 7 & 8. No stabling refunds will be provided after the show closing date under any circumstances.

Qualifying Criteria/Eligibility

1. To qualify for the Silver Dressage Championships, a horse/rider combination must compete in a minimum of **two competitions** (1 day or multiple days) and **earn two scores** of 55% or higher at two different competition days (from the same or different judges) at each level to be entered (including FEI).

Examples of ways to qualify:

- Ride at two 1 day competitions rider competes in 2 classes at each competition = 4 scores Scores from first competition are 56% & 58%
 Scores from second competition are 63% and 57%
 Rider would qualify with 58% from competition 1 and 63% from competition 2.
- Ride at 2 multiday competitions rider competes in 3 classes at each competition on three different days = 6 scores
 Scores from first competition are 54%, 50%, 57%
 Scores from the second competition are 60%, 62% & 56%
 Rider would qualify with 62% and 60% from the 2nd Competition as well as having competed in the 1st Competition (2 Competition ruling).

The Rider would not qualify if they only competed in the 2nd Competition.

 Ride at 1 single day competition and at 1 multiday competition- rider competes in 3 classes at the single day competition and the rider competes in 5 classes on three different days at the multiday competition = 7 scores.

Scores from the single day competition are 65%, 63% & 66% Scores from multiday competition are 58%, 60%, 64%, 63%, 64%

The Rider would qualify with 66% from the single day competition and 64% from the multiday competition.

The Rider could also qualify if they wanted to use the scores from the multiday competition fulfilling the 2-competition ruling.

- **The Rider would not qualify if they only competed in the multiday competition and not another competition.**
- 2. Shows/Competitions definition a show or competition may run 1 day or multiple days and be a sanctioned event with Equestrian Canada.
- 3. Both riders and owners must be members in good standing with PSO and hold an EC Silver Sport License or higher.
- 4. All horses must have a current EC Horse Recording. '
- 5. To qualify for the Silver Dressage Championship freestyle classes, a horse/rider combination must have competed in a minimum of two Silver competitions and earned two scores of 55% or higher in freestyle classes at different competitions (from the same or different judges) at each level (including FEI).

Qualifying Criteria/Eligibility Continued

- 6. In the event that class sizes must be limited, classes will be filled in descending order of the total of the technical qualifying scores submitted.
- 7. In the event that there are insufficient entries received, additional entries will be accepted (first come, first served) provided the horse/rider combination has competed in two Silver competitions at each level to be entered and has attained scores of 50% or above.
- 8. Horses may compete with two different riders at two consecutive levels if each horse/rider combination has qualified at the appropriate level.
- 9. Horse/Rider combinations may compete at two consecutive levels but in only one freestyle level.
- 10. No substitute riders are allowed.
- 11. No Hors Concours entries will be accepted.

Awards/Results

- Awards are based solely on the results of the Division classes. See Article E.9.9, Scores and Placing (page 77 of the EC Rule Book) as it pertains to single entry scores.
- At at all EC Championships competitions, any horse receiving less than 50% on a technical test will not be eligible for any class awards, championships or reserve championships.
- Class ribbons will be awarded to 8th place. Prizes will be awarded to those who place in accordance with sponsorship received.
- Should there be two judges for a class, the class score shall be the average of the two scores obtained from the judges.
- If there is a protest, it must be made in writing to the Show Secretary within 48 hours of the completion of the of the class concerned. A \$100 cash deposite must accompany the protest and will be foreited if the protest is not sustained (EC A1204).
- Details on presentation of awards will be posted on the day of the show. If presentations are mounted, horse and rider must be dressed appropriately and competitive numbers must be visible.
 For unmounted presentations, riders must be dressed appropriately. Non-compliance may result in forfeiture of any and all ribbons, awards and prizes for the class.
- Championships will be awarded at each level (Introductory through Advanced) in Open, Junior and Amateur Categories (except where indicated). Championships are determined by the total percentage of the two technical tests. The competitor with the highest total shall be declared the champion of his/her level and category (e.g.: Training Level, Junior, etc.) and the competitor with the second highest total shall be declared the reserve champion.
- Freestyle Championships will be awarded at each level (Training Level FEI Medium Tour) as an Open division only. Champions are determined by totalling the higher percentage from the two technical classes plus the percentage from the freestyle.
- The rider obtaining the highest score of the day will be awarded a special high score ribbon.

The CADORA-Ontario Team Competition

CADORA-Ontario is pleased to announce that the 2023 Silver Dressage Championships will host a Team Competition.

With a view to encouraging more participation, those CADORA-Ontario members who compete as individuals at either division of the Silver Dressage Championships are invited to form "teams" and compete together for ribbons and/or product prizes and prize money (all contingent upon the acquisition of the same).

Rules governing this Team Competition are as follows:

- All riders of all teams must be members of CADORA-Ontario (as of July 1, 2023).
- No additional entry fees are required to enter teams.
- There is no limit to the number of teams that can be fielded by any one CADORA-Ontario group and/or individuals at either division.
- All horses and riders may join only one team. A rider may join only one team within his/her division (Eastern/Western).
- All team riders must compete in their relevant technical classes.
- It is recommended that each team identify itself when making entries for the Silver Dressage Championships; however, teams can also be formed and identified at the Championships before the competition begins.
- Each team will consist of three horse/rider combinations.
- All teams entered MUST provide a team name.
- Any changes to a team (once identified) must be communicated to the respective divisional Show Secretary ASAP (before competition commences).
- The individual technical scores of each of the three team members will be added together to determine team placing. Freestyles are not part of the Team competition.
- Prize money, awards, etc. will be presented at the subsequent CADORA-Ontario Annual General Meeting/Awards banquet to all members of those teams that finish 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each Division.
- All riders of the first place teams, East and West, will be listed on the CADORA-Ontario Roster of Riders with their team name.
