The Westar Farms Derby Day Bronze competition is sanctioned as a Bronze competition member of Equestrian Canada 11 Hines, Suite 201, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K 2X1 and is governed by the rules of EC. A601.2

EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

ALL PERSONS SHALL BE COMMITTED TO:

- Upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors. or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions
- Actively promoting the development and adherence of competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

EC ACCIDENTS & RETURN TO PLAY RULE

Equestrian Canada's concussion related Accidents & Return-to-Play Rule came into effect Jan. 1/2017 for all EC sanctioned competitions in Canada. The full rule can be found in the EC Rules, Section A, General Regulations, Article 101. Key components of the rule include the following:

- In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, the competitors must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel on-site before continuing to compete.
- The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the on-site medical assessment takes place. Should a competitor refuse to be evaluated, they will be disqualified from the competition.
- If on-site qualified medical personnel suspect a concussion or believe the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor will be suspended from competition and placed on a Medical Suspension List until medically released.
- Competitors will remain on the EC Medical Suspension List until they submit an EC Return-to-Play Form, signed by a licensed physician, to EC.
- No competitor shall compete at EC sanctioned competitions while on the EC Medical Suspension List and competition organizers may refuse entry to anyone currently on the list.

EQUINE HEALTH & BIOSECURITY

In order to keep your horse and all horses on the show site as safe as possible please observe the following:

Proof of Vaccines: Proof of vaccines must be uploaded with your entries, indicating the horse's show name and date of administration of EHV 1 & 4 and Equine Influenza (as per Article A519). Competitors failing to meet this requirement will not be permitted entry. A current negative **Coggins Test** is required for all horses onsite and must be available upon request.

Equine Health Attestation: In making an entry at this show, each owner/trainer attests that, to their best of their knowledge, competing horse(s) under their care have not been in contact with any other horses (away or at their home facility) exhibiting symptoms or signs of illness within the last 21 days. They also agree to share knowledge of any sick or horse displaying symptoms of illness to show management immediately at the show office or entries@westarfarms.ca.

Contact information and contact tracing must be completed.

Non-Competing Horses: Each horse on the property must be declared and have a show number. Be sure to register any non-competing horses or be subject to a \$200 fine in addition to registration fees.

Site Entry & Biosecurity: In addition to rule A519 Vaccinations, biosecurity measures are in place for horses. All grooms, trainers, competitors and braiders are also responsible to follow safe practices if visiting more than one barn and are expected to limit their traffic footprint to their own stable area. The stabling area is closed to spectators.

Braiders: It is the braider's responsibility to ensure safe practices are followed if visiting multiple barns.

Working Together – Healthy People & Horses

- Maintain social distancing for horses; no nose-to-nose contact with other horses.
- Practice hand washing, particularly in between handling horses.
- Keep separate feed buckets, brushes, rags, and tack/equipment for each horse.
- Eliminate communal or shared water buckets.
- Ask your veterinarian about appropriate sanitizing solutions.
- Review and ensure you are prepared for quick implementation of an isolation plan at our competition grounds and/or at your home farm or facility.

EC COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS

As of July 1, 2023, the show office is required by EC to enforce Coach Status Requirements. Effective July 1, 2023, per Equestrian Canada's rules Canadian residents coaching athletes at sanctioned competitions must meet minimum Coach Status requirements as outline below.

Event Sanctioning	Minimum Coaching Status Requirement in 2023
EC Bronze and/or Silver	EC Registered Coach
EC Gold and/or Platinum	EC Licenced Coach

For those who do not meet the minimum requirements by July 1, the Temporary Coach Status will be applied and should be reviewed in advance.

In 2023, minimum Coach Status requirements will be enforced at all EC-sanctioned events. Recognizing some coaches will not have completed their EC Coach Status requirements when enforcement begins, the EC Board

approved. Temporary Coach Status (TCS) for the 2023 show season. Temporary Coach Status (TCS) will come into effect on July 1, 2023.

How is Coach Status obtained?

Coaches complete a TCS Form and submit this to the show office with appropriate payment. EC has mandated that the show office is not permitted to issue numbers to athletes of any coach with insufficient coaching status until the TCS form and fee has been submitted.

- The TCS Form will be available online; coaches are encouraged to complete and print the form before arriving at the show office to expedite processing.
- TCS Forms submitted without payment are incomplete.

Per EC, the TCS fee may not be added to a trainer split or applied to one or more athletes' show bill without written consent from those included on the split and/or bill(s). This fee is to be incurred by the coach and not the athlete(s).

RULES & REGULATIONS

- Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.
- Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition (A602.7).
- **Program Changes:** Every class offered herein is covered by the Rules and Specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book (A602.2). Westar Farms reserves the right to make changes to classes, change the order of classes, to cancel, reschedule, or combine any division they may deem advisable.
- When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. (A602.9).
- **Equine Medication Control:** Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for EMC while at the event location.
- All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations. (A602.8)
- **Coaches/ Trainers/Persons Responsible:** All trainers/coaches must carry the memberships and sport license equivalent to the level of competition where they are training/coaching. Effective July 2023, Coach Status is required to engage in coaching activities at EC sanctioned events. (A102.2) Coaches at Bronze level will be required to be Registered or Licensed Coaches.
- **Refusal of Entries:** Competitors on the [EC Not In Good Standing List](#) or the [EC Medical Suspension List](#) (Article 101 Section A, General Regulations) will be refused entries to the show.

- **Accounts** must be paid in full by end of show day, Sunday. A 3% admin charge (minimum \$10) will be added to the balance owing after the show day. Accounts unpaid beyond 30 days will further be assessed a 2% per month service fee. Any account unpaid beyond 14 days will be reported to EC.
- **Competition numbers** must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and exercise areas as well as in the show ring.
- **Helmets:** Anyone mounted on a horse on the competition grounds, including foreign competitors, must wear approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times.
- **Rider Falls:** Remounting not allowed. Rider must be checked by Paramedic before they can return to competition.
- **Horse Falls:** Horse must be cleared by a veterinarian before they return to competition. Any fees incurred are the sole responsibility of the competitor. (G. FEI 224.3 Falls)
- **NOTE:** In case of a fall of an athlete and/or a horse at any time in the Competition arena, in the practice arena or elsewhere within the grounds of the Event, the Athlete and or Horse must be cleared by the Event's medical service, respectively the Veterinary Delegate, before the Athlete and/or the Horse may be permitted to take part in the next round or Competition at the Event. In regards to riders - running/walking and falling, or off of golf carts, etc. Horses – shoulder and haunch touch the ground, or ground and obstacle.
- **Draw Reins** are not permissible in Hunter and Jumper Classes. (G 502.2 & G 202.2)
- **A horse/pony is limited to one round per class** including equitation and medal classes.
- **Hors Concours:** Not permitted.
- **Abuse:** Abuse of the horse is strictly forbidden. Excessive use of the whip – a horse should never be hit more than three times for any one incident. EC rule.
- **Dogs:** It is strongly recommended that dogs be left at home if possible. If not possible dogs must be left in the stabling area and be on a leash at all times. The owners of any dog that is caught will be subject to a \$100 fine. Owners of loose dogs that disrupt a rider on course will be charged for the entry fee of that class, in addition to the \$100 fine. Owners are required to abide by the “Poop and Scoop” by-law.

MEMBERSHIP RULES

- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide to the Horse Show Office proof of membership prior to competing.
- **Rider/Owner/Coach Memberships:** All riders, owners and coaches must have a current provincial membership (Ontario Equestrian or equivalent - [Join OE](#)) and Equestrian Canada (EC) Bronze or above sport license ([Join EC](#)). Purchase one before entering. Without a current membership, you will need to purchase a Temporary Membership.
- **Temporary Membership:** Points are not accumulated at a show for which a horse, rider or owner is entered under a Temporary Sport License or Temporary Horse Registration. Points are only accumulated for riders or horses where the rider, owner and horse has the memberships appropriate to their level of competition. Points are not awarded retroactively i.e. for any shows entered prior to their Sport License, Horse Recording or THJA membership renewal date.
- **Adult Amateur** riders must have Amateur Status on their Equine Canada membership card.

ENTRIES

Enter online: ESM <https://eqshowmanager.com> (*new url*). Set up an **Exhibitor Account** and **Horse Account** prior to making an entry. An Exhibitor Account can only be made by an adult. Add a **Person Account** when making entries for a junior rider or owner.

Closing Date: MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 4, 2023 - midnight.

Entry Changes: Cancel or change your entry online at any time up to the closing date without penalty. Substitute one horse for another at no additional cost. Substitution must be made in writing. An 'add at in-gate' fee will be charged a rate of \$5/class for all adds made after 4 pm the day prior to the show day.

Payment: Payment, a visa number or an open cheque must be presented to the show office before a number is issued or any additions or entry changes can be made. Pay by cheque to: Westar Farms, e-transfer to b.westar@gmail.com, Interac or Visa (\$12 service charge on all Visa payments). Please come to the show office at least one hour after your final class to close your account. All accounts must be paid in full by the end of the day Saturday, September 9, 2023. A 3% administration charge will be added to all accounts that are not closed by the end of the show and require follow up communication.

NSF cheques: will be assessed a \$50 surcharge.

Entry Cancellations: All entry cancellations after the closing date must be made in writing to info@westarfarms.ca.

- Entries cancelled more than 48 hours prior to the start of the show will be assessed the scratch fee of \$50.
- Cancelled entries providing less than 48 hours written notice prior to the start of the show, but before the start of the show will be assessed the administration fees and scratch fee. Class/division fees will be waived.
- No shows will be assessed a \$100 scratch and \$85 administration fee.
- There will be no refund for classes cancelled on the day of the show. You may change from one class and replace it with another, or change from one division to another.

Stalls are non-refundable after the entry closing date.

Show number: If not returned at the end of the show a \$5 replacement fee will be assessed.

Post entries: Add \$30, no exceptions. All entries received by the secretary following the closing date will be deemed a post entry. If you substitute one horse for another there will be no additional cost.

Prize money: will be credited against entries or paid by e transfer to payee listed in ESM.

STABLING

A limited number of stalls will be available in the new ringside stabling. Stalls, hay and shavings can be pre-ordered through the Service Order tab in ESM.

Arrivals: Friday, before show after 11:00 am **Departures:** Saturday, end of show day

Changes after the closing date must be done through email to entries@westarfarms.ca. You can increase your stall orders anytime as long as they remain available. Decreases can only be completed until the closing date.

Stalls are non-refundable if cancelled after the closing date unless they can be rebooked.

Stall and supply splits must be completed by Saturday at noon through your Exhibitor Account. If splits are not complete by this time, the trainer order will be evenly split amongst all entries under the trainer.

Hay and Shavings are not included in the price of the stall but can be ordered in advance, and are non-refundable once delivered.

Before you leave: Stalls must be stripped of all bedding before you leave and dumped into the manure pile between the stabling area and warm-up ring. If you choose not to strip your stall, please notify the show office with your stall number and pay the \$25 + hst stall cleaning fee. Stalls that are left with bedding and no notification to the show office will have a \$35 + hst stall cleaning fee billed to the Exhibitor Account under which they were booked.

SCHEDULED WARM-UPS

The **HUNTER Rings** will be open on Friday from 1:00 to 6:00 pm, weather permitting. A fee of \$30/round will apply. Sign up for Friday schooling classes (#200, 201) when submitting entries. Schooling classes are one round. Will run like a regular judged hunter class. Times will be assigned, multiple rounds permitted, show number must be worn. Showing horses pay per round. Non-showing horses pay per round fee + admin fee.

The **HUNTER DERBY Ring** will have two schooling course options. Multiple rounds permitted. Schooling rounds will also be available Saturday morning from 8:00 to 10:00 am.

The **GRAND PRIX Ring** will not be open on Friday, Sept. 8. Depending on weather, it may be booked online for schooling up to Tuesday, Sept. 5. [Book Grand Prix Ring schooling.](#)

Show morning: Flatting in hunter rings permitted until approx. 30 mins before show time, weather permitting.

CLASSES PER DIVISION

- Hunter Divisions: 2 OF + 1 US class
- Jumper Divisions: 3 classes
- Please enter all potential classes at time of entry to aid with scheduling.

FEATURE CLASSES – competitors entering these classes can either enter regular (non-Feature) classes or schooling classes with entries totaling at least \$75 or they will be assessed up to \$75 as a nomination fee.

- **OTTAWA REGIONAL FINALS:** In order to qualify for the, riders must have competed in a minimum of 3 OVPSC competitions.
- **ADMINISTRATION FEE:** Includes medic fee. An additional \$15 will be charged per additional rider on a horse.
- **TRAINER SPLITS:** Must be done online prior to any payments being processed.
- **CLASS ADDS:** Accepted until 4 pm the day prior to showing. After 4 pm the Add at In-gate Fee will apply per class.
- **ARRIVALS:** After 11:00 am Friday
- **DEPARTURES:** Stalls must be vacated one hour after last class of the day.
- **STALL CLEANING FEE:** Stalls must be stripped before you leave (all bedding please:). If you opt not to clean your stall, please come to the show office to pay the stall cleaning fee. Be sure to let us know the stall number and competitor #. A fee of \$35 will be applied for any stalls left not mucked or having made arrangements at the show office prior to leaving and will be charged to the Exhibitor account connected with the Service Fee.

Two round Hunter Derby open to horses competing in divisions up to 2'3" at this show. Prize money will be adjusted if less than 12 entries. Distances will not be adjusted. No combinations. The top 10 scoring competitors from the first round will be invited back for a second round.

WINNING THE HUNTER DERBY

In normal hunter classes, horses are marked down for behavior like shaking heads after a jump or showing expression. In the Hunter Derby, however, these behaviors are not discouraged, as the horse showing a little life. Balance, straightness, and good jumping style is still important, but horses who are daring, athletic, and show some expression will be rewarded. To win it, you must impress the judge with your horse's true jumping style and the brilliance of the round (successfully navigating a more difficult track will reward you!)

This class will run over a hunter-type course over obstacles found in the hunter ring and in the hunt field. In the Open Hunter Derby three heights will be offered, 2'6", 2'9" and 3'0", though all heights will be judged together. In the Pony Derby two heights will be offered 2'0" for Smalls, 2'0" or 2'3" for Mediums and 2'3" for Larges, though all heights will be judged together.

There will be **2 rounds - The Hunter Classic Course and The Handy Hunter Course**. They are described below. The top 10 horses from the Hunter Classic Course will be invited back to jump the Handy Hunter Course.

The course for the Hunter Derby is designed to more closely resemble the hunt field, with fewer ground lines, taller, narrower fences, gates, walls, hedges, and more. The approaches to jumps vary greatly, from short to long to serpentine, and are completely negotiable. Riders are rewarded for choosing more difficult routes, which can even include optional jumps.

Hunter Classic Course

- 10 jumps minimum
- At least one Bending Line
- There will be higher jumps set as option jumps
- Jumps: Obstacles will simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and the course should offer a variety of jumps with different appearances such as: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence or gate, coop, hedge, oxer, brush, logs, natural foliage.

Handy Hunter Course

- The Handy Hunter Course is about more than just cantering a series of jumps; it incorporates elements such as a walk or trot fence. The rules for the Handy Hunter are:
- Fence height 2'6 to 3'0" (Open) 2'0" to 2'3" (Ponies)
- There must be higher jumps set as option jumps

Hunter Derby Dress

Attire for the Hunter Derby is formal. Riders may wear a shad-belly, dark coat, beige breeches, and white shirt. Horses show in traditional hunter tack including snaffles or pelhams and double bridles.
