Closing dates: The Thursday, nine days prior the start of the competition week to avoid late fees.

Stalls: Subject to availability. Book online via the Service Order tab in egshowmanager.com

Entry deposit: A \$95 deposit + \$5 ESM system fee + hst must be paid by credit card upon entry for every entry.

EC and OE Membership and Amateur Status: Memberships will be electronically verified with the EC and OE databases. Provided you have submitted a COMPLETE entry form, including all required numbers and signatures, you will not be required to show us your membership cards, measurement cards, or recording cards. Incomplete entry forms will be charged a fee of \$25 and will be required to show proof of membership, etc. before number will be released. Competitors are responsible for their own errors and those of their agents in the preparation of their entry forms. Please ensure your entry form has been properly filled out.

COSTUME BONUS - July 19

Wear a costume to be eligible for extra prizes. Costume is not mandatory for participation. Best costumes win bonus awards: 1st: \$75 2nd: \$50 3rd: \$25

SERIES BONUS - awarded at Derby Day, September 6

To be eligible for series awards, horse rider combinations must compete in at least two of the three derbies and one of those must be Derby Day. You do not have to compete at same height at each show.

SERIES HI POINT COMPETITOR wins a VISION MODEL T PLUS SADDLE

No horse/rider combination cross entry between the two Derbies at one show. Minimum 12 horses required to run each class as specified. Class parameters will be adjusted if fewer than 12 entries.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES -

HORSE WELFARE Equestrian Canada (EC) is committed to fostering a safe and inclusive environment for all participants that is free from Abuse. The purpose of this Policy is to stress the importance of that commitment by educating Individuals and the public about Horse Abuse, outlining how EC will work to prevent Horse Abuse, and how such Abuse or suspected Abuse can be reported to and addressed by EC. EC requires that all Individuals adhere to this Code of Conduct and acknowledge and accept that the welfare of the Horse must always be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences. Section A Horse Welfare rules apply to all disciplines and all Section Rule Books. Rule exceptions in other Sections that contravene Section A Horse Welfare rules are not permitted and will not be approved. EC is committed to:

- recognizing Horses as sentient beings, defined by the ability to feel, perceive or experience subjectively. (ie. the animal is not only capable of feeling pain and distress but also can have positive psychological experiences, such as comfort, pleasure or interest that are appropriate to its species, environment and circumstances). To state that animals are sentient accepts that they can experience positive and negative emotions.

- upholding the welfare of the Horse, regardless of value and performance level, as the primary priority regardless of competitive commitments, expectations, or commercial influences;
- requiring the Horse to be treated with the highest level of care, compassion, respect, and empathy;
- requiring that no Horse be subjected to Abuse (ref: Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A General Regulations, Article A517) or Distress;
- ensuring that all Individuals accept and implement, at a minimum, the requirements within the National Farm Animal Care Council Equine Code of Practice
- ongoing support for scientific studies of animal-based indicators of pain, distress, and/or compromised welfare;
- increasing education and awareness for the evolution of best management and equine husbandry practices;
- requiring Individuals to know and follow the EC rules and implement industry regulations in all competitions; and,
- reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse. (A517.3c) The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

EC ACCIDENTS & RETURN TO PLAY RULE

Equestrian Canada's concussion related Accidents & Return-to-Play Rule came into effect Jan. 1/2017 for all EC sanctioned competitions in Canada. The full rule can be found in the EC Rules, Section A, General Regulations, Article 101. Key components of the rule include the following:

- In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, the competitors must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel on-site before continuing to compete.
- The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the on-site medical assessment takes place. Should a competitor refuse to be evaluated, they will be disqualified from the competition.

- If on-site qualified medical personnel suspect a concussion or believe the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor will be suspended from competition and placed on a Medical Suspension List until medically released.
- Competitors will remain on the EC Medical Suspension List until they submit an EC Return-to-Play Form, signed by a licensed physician, to EC.
- No competitor shall compete at EC sanctioned competitions while on the EC Medical Suspension List and competition organizers may refuse entry to anyone currently on the list.

EQUINE HEALTH & BIOSECURITY

Horse Health Requirements

In order to keep your horse and all horses on the show site as safe as possible please observe the following:

Proof of Vaccines: “All horse entered in any class at a competition must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.” (A602.8) Proof of current vaccines must be uploaded by the closing date at the first Westar show of the season attended, and must indicate the horse’s show name and date of administration of EHV 1 & 4 and Equine Influenza. Competitors failing to meet this requirement will not be permitted entry. An incomplete entry fee will be added to entries that do not have the vaccine certificate uploaded by the show closing date.

Coggins Test/Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA): Required for all horses onsite and must be emailed to: entries@westarfarms.ca.

Equine Health Attestation: In making an entry at this show, each owner/trainer attests that, to their best of their knowledge, competing horse(s) under their care have not been in contact with any other horses (away or at their home facility) exhibiting symptoms or signs of illness within the last 21 days. They also agree to share knowledge of any stabled horse displaying symptoms of infectious disease or have contact with any horses displaying such symptoms, and agree to immediately inform show management at the show office or by email to: entries@westarfarms.ca.

Contact information and contact tracing must be completed.

Site Entry & Biosecurity

Access the show site via the south entrance (closer to Dwyer Hill Rd) directly into the parking area. Please follow parking directions and be respectful of others, leaving space for large vehicles to maneuver and not blocking access routes. Cars must park long perimeter of parking field.

All horses must be registered with the show office. In addition to rule A519 Vaccinations, biosecurity measures are in place for horses. All grooms, trainers, competitors and braiders are also responsible to follow

safe practices if visiting more than one barn and are expected to limit their traffic footprint to their own stable area. New in 2026- It is the service provider’s (braider, farrier, physio, sports therapist, etc.) responsibility to have a record of all tents/stalls they have visited listing the horse’s name, trainer, date and time of the visit, and to have these records available for contact tracing purposes to management upon request. The stabling area is closed to spectators.

Healthy People & Horses

- Review and ensure you are prepared for quick implementation of an isolation plan at our competition grounds and/or at your home farm or facility.
- Isolate horses at first signs or symptoms of infectious disease and contact your vet immediately.
- Any horses with a temperature of 38.6C or 38.2 C if on an NSAID, or other temperature suppressing drug should isolate in separate facilities on the competition grounds or at separate veterinary facility off-site.
- Maintain social distancing for horses; no nose-to-nose contact with other horses.
- Practice hand washing, particularly in between handling horses.
- Keep separate feed buckets, brushes, rags, and tack/equipment for each horse.
- Eliminate communal or shared water buckets.
- Ask your veterinarian about appropriate sanitizing solutions.



EC SPORT LICENSING 2025

SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS:

- All coaches at EC-sanctioned events require EC Licensed Coach Status. For upgrading from Registered to Licensed Status, coaches can apply for a Temporary Coach Status (TCS) to fulfill the requirement for each event.
- New for 2025: A TCS may be purchased conveniently online via the MyEC Portal only. Each TCS is valid for a single event.

EMPOWERING SELF-COACHED ATHLETES:

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by providing their name and EC Sport Licence number on their entry form. Coaches that are not present at the event with the athlete are not to be listed on the entry form.

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EQUESTRIAN CANADA COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS

Coaches attending EC-Sanctioned competitions must hold a valid Licensed Coach Status. Any coach with Registered Coach Status must purchase a Single Event Upgrade for \$55.00. This purchase can be made through the My EC account.

Coaches without a valid Licensed Coach Status or Registered Coach Status are not eligible to be represented as a coach at EC-Sanctioned events and may be subject to fines.

MEMBERSHIP RULES

- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide to the Horse Show Office proof of membership prior to competing. No one will not be permitted to compete without a 2026 EC Sport Licence.
- **Rider/Owner/Coach Memberships:** All riders, owners and coaches must have a current provincial membership (Ontario Equestrian or equivalent - [Join OE](#)) and Equestrian Canada (EC) sport license ([Join EC](#)), Bronze or above to compete in Bronze classes, or Silver or above to compete in Trillium classes.
- **Horse Recording Requirements (A602.4)** In competitions that require Horse Recording numbers (Silver entries), all Canadian entries are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and must have paid the

EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit (A404).

Temporary Horse Recordings are no longer available.

- Points are not awarded retroactively i.e. for any shows entered prior to a competitor or owner's Sport License, Horse Recording or THJA membership renewal date.
- **THJA membership** is required for both owner and rider to accrue points for Trillium Championships and year end awards. This applies to both the Silver THJA and THJA/OVPSC classes where competitors wish to earn qualification for Trillium Championships.
- **Adult Amateur** riders must have Amateur Status on their Equine Canada membership card.



SHOW RULES

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.”

(A602.2). Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

- Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. (A602.8)
- Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition (A602.8).
- Any athlete at an EC sanctioned competition may be selected for human anti-doping as outlined in the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) and administered by Sport Integrity Canada. Please see EC General Regulations Section A - Appendix A1, Policy on Human Medications for details.
- Effective 2022, EC Sport License holders at least 18 years of age must complete recognized safe sport training modules addressing the recognition and prevention of maltreatment in sport and concussion.
- As per A602.5 Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for **equine medication control** while at the event location.
- **Coaches/Trainers:** When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. All trainers/coaches must carry the memberships and sport license equivalent to the level of competition where they are training/coaching. Effective July 2023, Coach Status is required to engage in coaching activities at EC sanctioned events. (A102.2) Coaches are required to be Licensed Coaches.
- **Program Changes:** Westar Farms reserves the right to make changes to classes, change the order of classes, to cancel, reschedule, or combine any division they may deem advisable.
- **Refusal of Entries:** Competitors on the EC Not In Good Standing List or the EC Medical Suspension List (Article 101 Section A, General Regulations) will be refused entries to the show.
- Individuals must have proper sport licence to compete. Without one, they will not be permitted to compete (A203)
- **Competition numbers** must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and exercise areas as well as in the show ring (Article A814).
- **Helmets:** Anyone mounted on a horse on the competition grounds, including foreign competitors, must wear approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times.
- **Jogging for Soundness:** At the Westar Farms Silver Competitions jogs for soundness will be conducted under Article G401.5. Horses/ponies are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over fences performance in all except miscellaneous hunter classes. Horses/ponies that are unsound will be eliminated and ineligible for an award in that class. The judge’s decision regarding soundness is final.
- **Fall:** In case of a fall of an athlete and/or a horse at any time in the Competition arena, in the practice arena or elsewhere within the grounds of the Event, the Athlete and or Horse must be cleared by the Event’s medical service, respectively the Veterinary Delegate, before the Athlete and/or the Horse may be permitted to take part in the next round or Competition at the Event. In regards to riders - running/walking and falling, or off golf carts, etc. Horses – shoulder and haunch touch the ground, or ground and obstacle.
- **Draw Reins** are not permissible in Hunter and Jumper Classes. (G 502.2 & G 202.2)
- A **horse/pony is limited to one round per class** including equitation and medal classes.
- **Hors Concours:** Not permitted in any hunter classes. Only permitted in the .65 m Jumper classes.
- **Protests:** Must be made in writing within 48 hours of the completion of competition and accompanied by a deposit of \$125.00 cash or certified cheque payable to Equestrian Canada. (See EC Rules).

ENTRIES

Making an Entry

Closing Date: The Thursday (9 days ahead) the week before the start of the competition to avoid late fees.

Administration fee: Payable upon entry submission and non-refundable after the closing date. The deposit (Admin fee + ESM system fee) must be paid for each entry by credit card before the entry can be completed.

Incomplete Entries: By the show closing date, all requested information must be complete and accurate including (but not limited to) contact information for rider and owner (including valid and current email address), current memberships, and current vaccination record uploads which must include vaccination date. A \$25 incomplete entry fee will be charged if any requested information is missing. Incomplete or inaccurate entry forms may invalidate points earned at EC sanctioned competitions and are subject to further EC penalties.

Post Entries

Add \$50, no exceptions. All entries received by the show office after the closing date will be deemed a post entry. If you substitute one horse for another there will be no additional cost.

Entry Changes

- Cancel or change your entry at any time on ESM up to the closing date without penalty.
- Substitute one horse for another at no additional cost. Substitution must be made in writing to entries@westarfarms.ca.
- A Late Class Add fee of \$10/class will be charged for all adds made after 4 pm the day prior to the show day.

Non-Showing Horses

Both owner and rider must provide a current OE or equivalent membership number. A \$55 fee per horse will be charged. Drug testing and Levy fees will be waived. Non-Showing horses must abide by all Westar Farms rules. Horses found on the property without an entry form will be charged an additional fine of \$200.

Entry Cancellations

All entry cancellations after the closing date must be made in writing to entries@westarfarms.ca.

- **Entry cancellation 1:** after the closing date but prior to 9 am the Friday of the show will be assessed the administration fee + ESM fee (\$100 + hst).
- **Entry cancellation 2:** after 9 am the Friday of the show will be assessed a \$50 scratch fee plus \$100 admin/ESM fee. Class/division fees will be waived.
- 'No shows' will be assessed a \$100 scratch, \$5 ESM fee, and \$95 administration fee, plus any associated service fees.
- There will be no refund for classes cancelled on the day of the show without written notice. You may change from one class and replace it with another, or change from one division to another.
- Stalls are non-refundable after the entry closing date.

Payment of Entries

- Show numbers will only be issued with either a credit card on file or an open cheque. Accounts can be left open for the duration of the show.
- Payment can be made by credit card, cash, cheque (payable to: Westar Farms) or e transfer (include rider # or rider name in comments so that payment can be credited to your account). A \$12 fee will be added to all credit card payments. (This does not apply to the entry deposit).
- All accounts must be paid in full by the end of the day on Sunday of the show, either by paying online or in person at the show office. However, if you do not do so, you automatically agree to authorize Westar Farms to charge your credit card for all fees owed. Individual named as 'Person Responsible' on entry form will be held financially responsible for any clients who do not submit viable payment in a timely matter.
- A 3% administration charge will be added to all accounts that are not closed by the end of the show (minimum \$10) and require follow up communication. Interest (2.5% per month) will accrue for accounts that go unpaid beyond 30 days.
- Unsettled accounts will be turned over to EC on the 14th day following the show, which may result in suspension from all competitions.
- **NSF cheques:** will be assessed a \$50 surcharge.
- **Show number:** If not returned at the end of the show a \$5 replacement fee will be assessed.

STABLING

STALL ORDERS

Group show stall orders (4+ stalls on one order at show stall rate) can be made up to **six weeks** ahead.

Individual show stall orders (3 or fewer stalls at show stall rate) will be available **3 weeks** before the start of each show.

Day stall orders will be available **2 weeks** before each show.

Please request only the number of stalls you need

Tack stalls or non-horse stalls: Due to limited number of stalls, only those reserving 8 or more show stalls may book a non-horse stall and only one is permitted per group. With the layout of the barns, most groups will have an 'end' for storage.

Changes after the closing date must be done by email to entries@westarfarms.ca. You can increase your stall orders anytime as long as they remain available.

Decreases can only be completed until the closing date. Stalls are non-refundable if cancelled after the closing date.

If you plan to reduce your stall count before the closing date, please don't delete them in ESM. Instead, notify the show office so stalls can be assigned to the next person in line if there is a waiting list. We will reduce your stall count.

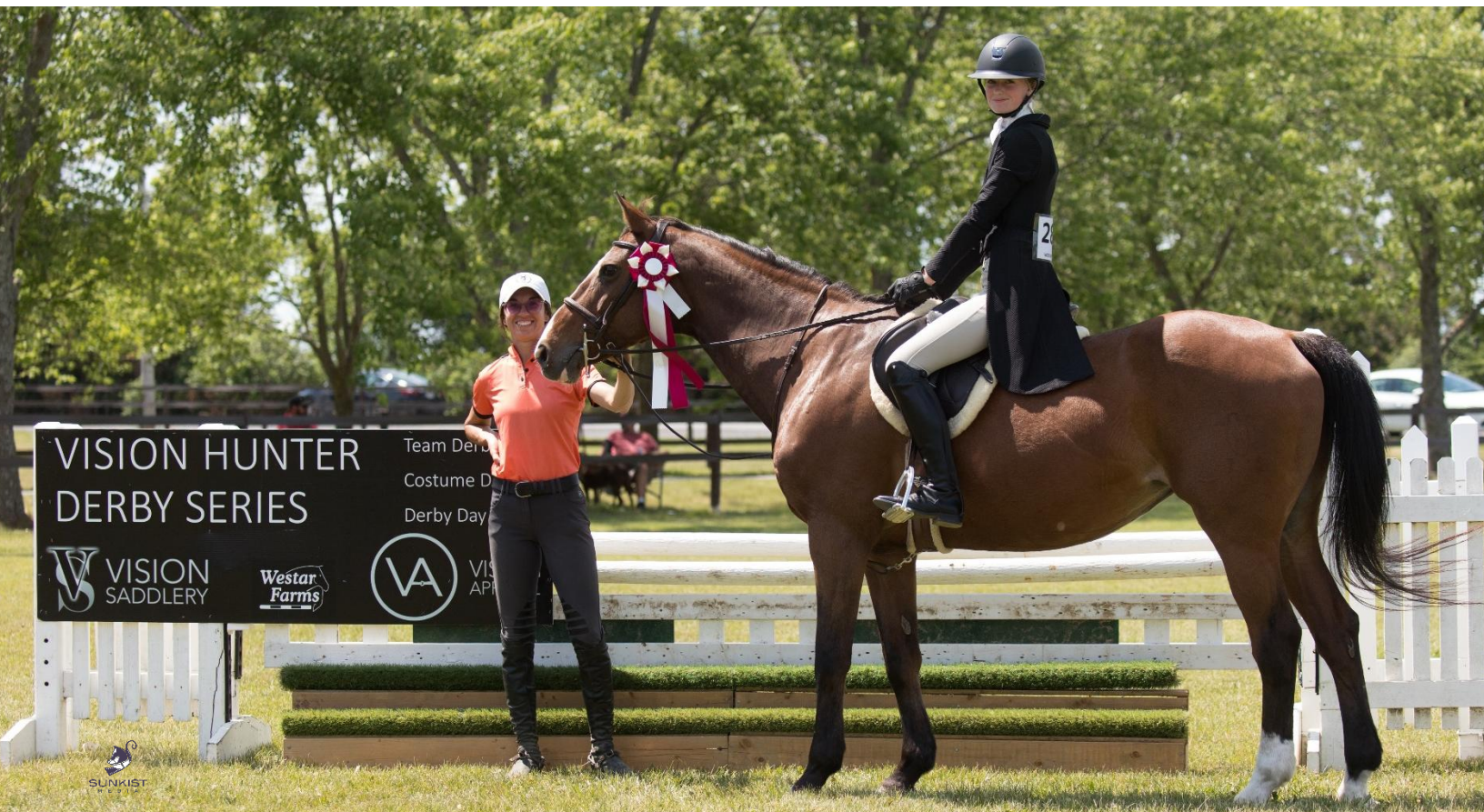
Stall and supply splits must be completed before show numbers are released. Incomplete splits will have a 3% late split fee applied to the Exhibitor Account. Splits can be done online by the Exhibitor, directly in ESM or by the trainer in the show office.

Hay and Shavings can be ordered in advance in the **Service Order** tab in **ESM**, and are non-refundable once delivered. Orders only accepted until noon on Saturday. Hay: \$13 per bale, shavings: \$11.50 per bag.

SCHEDULED WARM-UPS

HUNTER rings will be open on Friday from noon to 5:30 pm, weather permitting. A fee of \$35/round will apply. Sign up for Friday schooling classes when submitting entries. Schooling rounds will be allotted set amounts of time based on the number of horses in the ring.

Show number must be worn. If you wish more time, additional 'rounds' will be added to the show bill. Showing horses pay per round. Non-showing horses pay per round fee + admin fee. Show mornings: Flatting in hunter rings permitted until approx. 30 mins before show time, weather permitting.



POINT ACCUMULATION & CHAMPIONSHIPS QUALIFICATION

Points are only accrued from the date that appropriate memberships are in place. Points cannot be accrued retroactively.

Entries are subject to the specifications of any division in which they wish to compete, including EC membership rules.

THJA Zone Awards

In order to qualify for Year End Zone Awards, participants must have attended at least 50% (4) of the competitions offered in the Trillium Zone East. Due to the increase in extreme seasonal weather events, consideration will be given for any competition impacted. For more information regarding points accumulation, please visit

THJA entries are eligible to compete in their respective Trillium Equitation on the Flat classes and Hack Division provided both owner and rider have EC Silver Sport Licence (Equitation and Hack Division) and EC Horse Recording (Equitation classes) as per EC rules, and THJA memberships.

THJA Championships Qualification

The 50% rule for Championships qualification has been waived. Competitors must compete (ie. marked on a judge's card) at a minimum of one (1) THJA show in order to qualify for their respective class/division

OVPSC/THJA Bronze Divisions

2'3" Bronze Open Hunter, Cross Rails, .65m Open Jumper, .75m Open Jumper and .75m Jumper Medal

Only those entrants with THJA memberships, and who have paid THJA levies, will accumulate points in these divisions and classes towards the Trillium Championships qualification.

Points for entrants in these divisions and classes will also be accumulated for Ottawa Bronze Finals qualification and for OVPSC circuit awards.

OVPSC

In order to qualify for the Ottawa Bronze Finals, participants must have attended a minimum of 2 OVPSC competitions. In order to qualify for Year End Awards, participants must have attended a minimum of 3 OVPSC competitions (may include Ottawa Bronze Finals).

OVPSC General Specifications

- In the interest of horse welfare, it is encouraged that riders and trainers consider limiting the number of classes a horse participates in per competition.
- A rider's and horse's eligibility will be verified. Should it be determined that either are ineligible, points will be retroactively revoked. No refunds will be issued.
- Competing in the Cross Rails Division will not count towards years of eligibility.
- For clarity, a competitor is deemed to have competed when their entry number is marked on a judge's card and they received a score.
- Horses and ponies are permitted to enter all OVPSC classes and divisions. Distances will not be adjusted.
- OVPSC divisions do not qualify for Trillium Championships, with the exception of the following divisions: Cross Rails Division, 2'3" Open Hunter Division, .65m Jumper Division, .75m Jumper Division, and .75m Jumper Medal.
- In under saddle or flat classes, not more than 10 horses shall canter at one time.
- Riders have the option to compete solely in the under saddle class of a division. Points will not count towards championships or annual year end awards.
- In the case of any discrepancy, the website shall be considered to be the official and correct source of information.

OVPSC Bronze Hunter Divisions

- **Intro Hunter:** Maximum jump height of 18" with no oxers. Open to beginner riders in their first or second year of showing. Trot changes are permitted. Riders may cross enter into 2'0" Hunter, Pre-Novice or School Horse as long as they meet division qualifications.
- **Pre-Novice*:** Maximum jump height of 2'0. Oxers are permitted. Open to Jr/AM riders in their first year of showing, with the exception of Intro Hunter or beginner divisions. Trot changes are permitted. Riders may cross enter into Intro Hunter, 2'0" Hunter or School Horse as long as they meet division qualifications. If not competing in Intro Hunter, these riders may cross enter into the 2'3" Bronze Jr/Am Hunter division.

- **School Horse*:** Maximum jump height of 2'0" with no oxers. Open to Jr/AM riders enrolled in a weekly lesson program riding horses or ponies, owned by, or leased to a riding school, and used regularly in a riding school lesson program. Trot changes are permitted. Riders may cross enter into Intro Hunter, Pre-Novice or 2'0" Hunter or as long as they meet division qualifications. Riders competing above 2'3" on any circuit are no longer eligible to compete in the School Horse division in the same calendar year.
- Please note: A school horse is a horse or pony ridden by different riders on a regular basis in an ongoing lesson program. If a horse/pony is full-leased to a rider it is not considered a school horse.
- **2'0" Bronze Hunter:** Maximum jump height of 2'0" with no oxers. Open to all riders, horses and ponies.
- **2'3" Bronze Junior/Amateur Hunter:** Maximum jump height of 2'3". Oxers are permitted. Open to JR/AM riders. Riders cannot cross-enter into any division with a jump height exceeding 2'6" at the same competition or have competed above 2'6" in the last three years on any circuit. Does not qualify for Trillium Championships.

OVPSC Bronze Jumper Division

- **.85m Open Jumper Division**
Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum spread .95m. Run under Table A. Combinations must be vertical to vertical or oxer to vertical.

OVPSC Bronze Equitation Divisions

- **Bronze Equitation Over Fence and on the Flat:** Maximum jump height of 2'0". Oxers are permitted. Open to eligible Jr/AM who have competed up to a jumping height not exceeding 2'3" on any circuit. Trot changes are permitted.

THJA/OVPSC BRONZE DIVISIONS

Refer to www.ovpsc.ca or www.thja.ca for up-to-date specifications.

The Trillium Zone East and OVPSC, together, offer the following Bronze sanctioned divisions and classes: 2'3" Open Hunter, .65 m Open Jumper, .75 m Open Jumper divisions and the .75 m Jumper Medal.

Provided they meet eligibility requirements, competitors may be eligible to compete at both the Trillium Championships and Ottawa Bronze Finals. They may also be eligible for TZE and OVPSC co-sponsored year-end circuit awards presented to 10th place. Competitors must attend 2 OVPSC competitions in order to compete at the Ottawa Bronze Finals and 3 to qualify for year-end awards.

2'3" Open Hunter: Maximum jump height of 2'3"
Open to all riders. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition on the same day(G201.2(c)).

Cross Rails Hunter: Maximum jump height of 12"
Open to all horses and ponies. Open to Jr/AM riders. Distances will not be adjusted. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition on the same day(G201.2(c)). Riders may only cross-enter into age-appropriate equitation on the flat and hack division and any specialty class(es) at the Trillium Championships designed specifically for riders in this division.

.65m Open Jumper
Open to all riders. Open to all horses and ponies. No combinations. Time allowed of 325 metres per minute. Run under Table A.

.75 m Open Jumper

Open to all riders. Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum spread .85m. Combinations are limited to a minimum of two strides - vertical to vertical or oxer to vertical. Run under Table A.

.75m Jumper Medal

This class is open to Junior and Amateur riders only. This class has a jumping phase with the flat phase at the judge's discretion. Jumping phase to be ridden first. Additional testing options also at the judge's discretion. If there are two phases, the medal will be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

Tack & Equipment: All tack and equipment remain the same for both phases. Only running martingales used in the conventional manner are permitted. No standing martingales, draw reins or restricted running martingales are permitted. Conservative coloured headgear (As per Article G1109) with no additional adornment. Stirrups are restricted as per Article G1109-G).

Jumping Phase – The jumping phase should be over an equitation type course of at least nine (9) fences. Fences will not exceed .75m in height with a spread not to exceed the height.

Flat Phase – At the judge's discretion, all riders, or a maximum of 12 who complete the jumping phase, may be called back to perform on the flat and demonstrate tests on the flat of the judge's choosing. The top four (4) riders in the flat phase **may** then be asked to complete a short test including fences determined by the judge. When this test is being ridden, the riders will turn their backs so they cannot watch the other competitors.

THJA BRONZE DIVISION

Please refer to www.thja.ca for up-to-date specifications. Open to riders 12 years of age and older on January 1st and adult amateur riders on horses and ponies. Distances will not be adjusted. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same

competition on the same day (G201.2(c)). Long stirrup riders may not enter any other classes except for age-appropriate equitation on the flat, hack division and any specialty class(es) at the Trillium Championships designed specifically for riders in this division.

THJA SILVER DIVISIONS

Please refer to www.thja.ca for up-to-date specifications.

Certain (hunter and jumper) divisions may be combined at qualifying competitions throughout the season.

PILOT PROGRAM FOR 2026

EC G306.2 Adults are permitted to show (be judged) on ponies in miscellaneous non-rated EC sanctioned classes not limited to juniors. Adult Amateurs may ride large ponies in Adult Amateur classes where fences do not exceed 3' (0.90M). See G309 and G310. A pony shown in any judged class(es), either hunter or jumper, by an adult may not be shown in judged classes by a junior on the same day. An adult competing on a pony in miscellaneous non-rated EC sanctioned classes must not compete higher than the pony's appropriate obstacle height as per G302. Open Card schoolings will be judged and red/blue ribbons awarded. Suitability of the pony to the rider and manners of the pony must be emphasized in all classes. Judges must penalize but not necessarily eliminate an entry for not having such suitability and manners.

PONY DIVISIONS & SHORT STIRRUP

Every pony entered in a pony division must have a valid Equestrian Canada pony measurement on file with Equestrian Canada. USEF pony measurement cards are also acceptable.

- **Small Pony Hunter Division:** Fences 2'3". Open to ponies not exceeding 12.2hh. Small pony riders must be 14 years of age and under as of January 1st of the competition year.
- **Medium Pony Hunter Division:** Fences 2'6". Open to ponies exceeding 12.2hh, but not exceeding 13.2hh. Medium pony riders must be 14 years of age and under as of January 1st of the competition year.
- **Large Pony Hunter Division:** Fences 2'9". Open to ponies exceeding 13.2hh, but not exceeding 14.2hh. Large pony riders must be 17 years of age and under as of January 1st of the competition year.
- **Modified Pony Hunter Division:** Small – Not to exceed 2'; Medium – Not to exceed 2'3"; Large – Not to exceed 2'6". Open to all ponies. Ponies will jump 3" below their regular pony hunter division height and distances will be adjusted according to pony size as per EC Rules G306.6.A. Age restrictions as per EC Rules G306.1. Pony/rider combinations may not cross enter into any other classes or divisions requiring them to jump with the exception of the Modified Pony Medal and their age respective equitation on the flat.
- **Short Stirrup Division:** 21" Verticals Only. Open to "C" riders. Open to both horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted. Riders may not enter any other classes except for "C" Equitation on the flat and My First Medal. Riders in the under saddle class must be short stirrup eligible.

JUNIOR DIVISIONS

- **Children's Hunter:** Fences 3'0". Open to horses ridden by a junior. As per Equestrian Canada Rules Article G307. Riders in this division may cross enter to the Low Hunter Division and the Trillium Hunter Division at 3'3" and any other division to which they are eligible.
- **2'9" Children's Hunter Division:** Fences 2'9". Open to juniors riding horses. A horse/rider combination may only cross enter into the Hack Division, the Low/High Open Hunter Division, the 2'9" Children's Trillium Medal, and their age-appropriate equitation on the flat class. The rider may enter in any other division or class at that show on another horse or pony. The horse may be shown in another class/division with another rider.
- **2'3"/2'6" Low High Children's Hunter Division:** Fences 2'3" or 2'6". Open to junior riders on horses and ponies. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior on the same day (G201.2). Distances will not be adjusted. Riders may compete in any eligible division with a height of 2'6" and under. If also competing in the Low/High Open Hunter Division, they are only eligible to compete at the 2'6" (Low) height. Horse/rider combinations are also permitted to show in the Hack division, age-appropriate equitation on the flat and the 2'3"/2'6" Low High Children's Medal. Competitors may move up or down a height throughout the season but cannot change heights at an individual show.

· ADULT AMATEUR DIVISIONS

All adult amateurs must possess a current EC amateur card which is purchased annually.

Adult amateurs may ride horses or large ponies. Please note that a pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition (G201.2)

- **Adult Amateur Hunter:** Fences 3'. As per Equestrian Canada Article G309. Open to horses and large ponies. Riders in this division may cross enter to the Trillium Hunter Division at 3'3" and any other division to which they are eligible.
- **2'9" Adult Amateur Hunter Division:** Fences 2'9". Open to horses and large ponies. A horse/rider combination may only cross enter into the hack division, the low/high open hunter division, the 2'9" adult trillium medal, and adult equitation on the flat. The rider may enter in any other division or class at that show on another horse or pony. The horse may be shown in another class/division with another rider.
- **2'3"/2'6" Low High Adult Amateur Hunter Division:** Fences 2'3" and 2'6". Open to adult amateur riders on horses and ponies. A small pony may only compete at the 2'3" height of this division. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior on the same day (G201.2). Distances will not be adjusted. Riders may compete in any eligible division with a height 2'6" and under. If also competing in the Low/High Open Hunter division, they are only eligible to compete at the 2'6" (low) height. Horse/rider combinations are also permitted to show in the Hack Division, the 2'3"/2'6" Low High Adult Medal and adult equitation on the flat. Competitors may move up or down a height throughout the season but cannot change heights at an individual show.

OPEN DIVISIONS

- **2'6"/2'9" Low/High Open Hunter Division:** This division is open to all horses and medium and large ponies. A medium pony ridden by an adult may only compete at the 2'6" height. Horse and rider combinations may only cross enter to divisions requiring them to jump 2'9" and under, the Hack division, and their age appropriate equitation on the flat. Competitors may move up and down in heights between shows, but competitors may not change heights at an individual show. Competitors must declare height on their Championship Show Entry Form.

- Note: 2'3"/2'6" Low High Adult Amateur and 2'3"/2'6" Low High Children competitors may only jump at the 2'6" height in this division.
- **Low Hunter:** Fences 3'. Open to all eligible horses and riders (refer to specifications for any restricted divisions).
- **3'3"/3'6" Trillium Hunter:** The low option of this division is open to all eligible riders. The high option of this division is not open to Children's or Adult Amateur Division riders.
- **Hack Division:** Road Hack/Show Hack/Pleasure Hack As per Equestrian Canada Chapter 12 and 13 – Classes Refer to Article G1301-1303.

JUMPER DIVISIONS

Horses are to be judged only on performance over a pre-designated course. The competition management must ensure that a plan giving precise detail of the course is posted at least 30 minutes before start of competition. Jumper tack as per Equestrian Canada Rules.

- **0.90 m Jumper Division:** Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum spread 1m. Run under Table A.
- **1.0 m Jumper Division:** Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum spread 1.10m. Run under Table A.
- **1.10 m Trillium Jumper Division:** Open to all horses. Maximum spread 1.20m. Run under Table A.

C Equitation On the Flat and Over Fences

 (Eligibility as per EC Rules)

In the 2026 EC Rule Book, the guide for junior ages is:

- Junior “A” – a rider who is 15, 16, 17 on January 1st
- Junior “B” – a rider who is 12, 13, 14 on January 1st
- Junior “C” – a rider who is under 12 on January 1st
- Junior “A” Riders may not ride “B” or “C” ponies
- Junior “B” Riders may ride “A”, “B”, or “C” ponies
- Junior “C” Riders may ride “A”, “B”, or “C” ponies

For show purposes, ponies are to be divided as follows:

- “A” ponies – over 13.2 hands, but not to exceed 14.2 hands
- “B” ponies – over 12.2 hands, but not to exceed 13.2 hands
- “C” ponies – do not exceed 12.2 hands

Trillium “A” Equitation Over Fences – Open to Large Pony Division riders with fences at 2’9”; Children’s Division riders with fences at 3’; and Trillium Low/High division riders with fences at 3’3”. In the event a rider competes in two different divisions requiring them to jump different heights, it will be their choice which height they will jump for the equitation over fences class. This choice needs to be indicated on the entry form.

Trillium “B” and “C” Equitation Over Fences - Classes are open to small ponies with fences at 2’3”, medium ponies with fences at 2’6”, large ponies at 2’9” and horses at 3’.

Adult Equitation – Adult equitation riders must be amateurs.

A horse or pony ridden in an equitation class over fences, or in the jumper medal class may only be ridden in that class by one rider.

In the event a rider competes in two different divisions requiring them to jump different heights, it will be their choice which height they will jump for the equitation over fences class. This choice needs to be indicated on the entry form.

Trillium Hunter Medals

- Children’s Medal 3’ Medal
- 2’9” Child/Adult Medal
- Short Stirrup Medal
- .90/1 m Harriet Cherry Jumper
- 2’3”/2’6” Children’s Medal
- 2’3”/2’6” Adult Medal
- Modified Pony Medal

Trillium Hunter Medals: Originally created in the image of the Jump Canada Medal, the Trillium Medal Class has evolved into a specialty class unique to the Trillium Circuit. Where a contradiction exists, these specifications supersede those of the Equestrian Canada Jump Canada Medal. These classes are open to Junior and Amateur riders only. Riders may walk the course. Eligibility as per individual hunter division specs for the particular medal.

First Phase - Over Fences: Figure eight course of not less than eight jumps. Class is judged in accordance with Article G1008 Class Routine Over Fences. No additional tests over fences are permitted.

Second Phase - On The Flat: At the discretion of the judge, all contestants, or a minimum of ten shall be called back to perform at a walk, trot, and canter. From a maximum of four competitors, the judge may call for a minimum of two or more requirements from Article G1009 Tests (Equestrian Canada Rule Book Section G)
Scoring: If the judge tests over two phases, medal classes will be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

Tack & Equipment: All tack and equipment remain the same for both phases. Restrictions as per Article G1003 through G1005 (Equestrian Canada Rule Book Section G)

Harriet Cherry Jumper Medal: Fences not to exceed 1 Metre. Originally created on the image of the CET Medal, the Trillium Jumper Medal has evolved into a specialty class unique to the Trillium Circuit. These specifications supersede those of the Equestrian Canada CET medal.

This class is open to Junior and Amateur riders only. This class has a jumping phase with the flat phase at the judge’s discretion. Jumping phase to be ridden first. Additional testing options also at the judge’s discretion. If there are two phases, the medal will be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

Tack & Equipment: All tack and equipment remain the same for both phases. Only running martingales used in the conventional manner are permitted. No standing martingales, draw reins or restricted running martingales are permitted. Conservative coloured headgear (As per Article G1109) with no additional adornment. Stirrups are restricted as per Article G1109-G).

Jumping Phase – The jumping phase should be over an equitation type course of at least nine (9) fences. Fences will not exceed .90M in height with a

spread not to exceed the height. The course must contain at least one double or triple combination with at least one spread fence. Other spread fences are required elsewhere on the course. Flat Phase – At the judge’s discretion, all riders, or a maximum of 12 who complete the jumping phase, may be called back to perform on the flat and demonstrate tests on the flat of the judge’s choosing. The top four (4) riders in the flat phase **may** then be asked to complete a short test including fences determined by the judge. When this test is being ridden, the riders will turn their backs so they cannot watch the other competitors.
