These competitions are sanctioned as Silver competition members of Equestrian Canada % of House of Sport, 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, K1H 7X7 and are governed by the rules of EC (A602.1).

An Equestrian Canada (EC) Silver (or higher) Sport License, and Ontario Equestrian (OE) Membership are required for the rider. Fees are to be paid to EC and Ontario Equestrian respectively.

Horses must also have an Equestrian Canada Horse Recording.

Riders do not have to be members of Ontario Dressage to compete in the Championships however non-members are not eligible for year-end awards, the Team Competition or the Championship Challenge.

Riders are responsible for knowledge of the Rules & Regulations governing the Horse Show and for their own errors and omissions.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES -

HORSE WELFARE

- Equestrian Canada (EC) is committed to fostering a safe and inclusive environment for all participants that is free from abuse. The purpose of this Policy is to stress the importance of that commitment by educating Individuals and the public about Horse Abuse, outlining how EC will work to prevent Horse Abuse, and how such Abuse or suspected Abuse can be reported to and addressed by EC.
- EC requires that all Individuals adhere to this Code of Conduct and acknowledge and accept that the welfare of the Horse must always be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.
- Section A Horse Welfare rules apply to all disciplines and all Section Rule Books. Rule exceptions in other Sections that contravene Section A Horse Welfare rules are not permitted and will not be approved.
- EC is committed to:
 - Recognizing horses as sentient beings, defined by the ability to feel, perceive or experience subjectively. (i.e. the animal is not only capable of feeling pain and distress but also can have positive psychological experiences, such as comfort, pleasure or interest that are appropriate to its species, environment and circumstances). To state that animals are sentient accepts that they can experience positive and negative emotions.
 - Upholding the welfare of the Horse, regardless of value and performance level, as the primary priority regardless of competitive commitments, expectations, or commercial influences;
 - Requiring the Horse to be treated with the highest level of care, compassion, respect, and empathy;
 - Requiring that no Horse be subjected to Abuse (ref: Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A General Regulations, Article A517) or Distress;
 - Ensuring that all Individuals accept and implement, at a minimum, the requirements within the National Farm Animal Care Council Equine Code of Practice;
 - Ongoing support for scientific studies of animal-based indicators of pain, Page 2 2026 Rules of Equestrian Canada Section A Distress, and/or compromised welfare;
 - Increasing education and awareness for the evolution of best management and equine husbandry practices;
 - Requiring Individuals to know and follow the EC rules and implement industry regulations in all competitions; and,
 - Reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.



EQUESTRIAN CANADA

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

(A602.2) Every class offered herein, which are covered by the rules and specifications of the current “EC Rules”, will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. All questions not covered by these rules shall be decided by the show management, whose decision will be final.

(A602.4) All Canadian entries are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. (See A404).

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide to the Horse Show Office proof of membership prior to competing. Anyone competing without proof of 2026 EC Sport License or without Valid EC Horse Recording will not be permitted to compete. No temporary horse recordings or temporary sport licenses will be available in 2026. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit (See A404).

(A602.5) Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.

(A602.6) Any athlete at an EC sanctioned competition may be selected for human anti-doping as outlined in the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) and administered by Sport Integrity Canada. Please see EC General Regulations Section A - Appendix A1, Policy on Human Medications for details.

(A602.7) Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition.

Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. Show management reserves the right to refuse entries based on EC rules.

(A602.8) All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations. All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule will be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition Management.

(A517.3c) The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

(A517.5C) Effective January 1, 2026, the following provisions apply **at all national competitions** regarding permitted noseband tightness. The noseband must be adjusted with sufficient laxity, as determined by an EC approved Measuring Device. The rule applies to all types of nosebands and to both the upper and lower noseband.



COACH STATUS

EC Coach Status Requirements

(A602.9) When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

Coaches attending EC-Sanctioned competitions must hold a valid Licensed Coach Status. Any Coach with Registered Coach Status must purchase a Single Event update for \$55.00. This purchase can be made through the My EC account. In 2026, Coach Status requirements will be enforced at all EC-sanctioned events. (A103)

Coaches without a valid Licensed Coach Status or Registered Coach Status with a Single Event Upgrade are not eligible to be represented as a coach at EC-Sanctioned events and may be subject to fines. (A103.4) Coaches are reminded complete their coaching requirements in advance to avoid any fines or delays.

Riders without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by entering their own EC Sport License Number or entering “self-coached” in the Coach Field on their registration/entry form.

Coaches not attending the competition should not be listed on the entry form.





CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

RULES PERTAINING TO CHAMPIONSHIPS

This competition is a Championship, please refer to the 2026 Rules, Section E Article 7.1 through 7.15 that relate to CHAMPIONSHIP competitions ONLY.

The following rules are specific to Championships

- **ARTICLE E 7.3.1 SCHOOLING OF HORSES/PONIES (Elimination)**
Schooling horses/ponies at all championship competitions may only be done by the competing rider. A groom mounted in the saddle may walk the horse/pony on a long rein. Para dressage riders see **EXCEPTION** ART E 7.3.2 Equestrians riding PE tests see Chapter 6 Para Equestrian.
- **ARTICLE E 7.4 Whips (Elimination)**
Whips may not be carried at championships (ART E 7.4.1). Whips are not permitted upon entering the space surrounding the competition arena. Exception: Para dressage riders see ART 6.9 & side-saddle riders see Chapter 5.
- **ARTICLE E 7.5.1 Tack Check (Elimination)**
Tack checks are mandatory for all championship competitions.
- **ARTICLE E 7.6 CALLING TESTS**
All tests at championship competitions must be ridden from memory.
- **ARTICLE E 7.7 RIBBONS, PRIZES AND CHAMPIONSHIP TITLES**
Any rider /horse combination receiving less than 50% of the total points obtainable in a test shall not be eligible for championships awards, ribbons, prizes or titles.
- **ARTICLE E 7.8 ARENA SIZE FOR SPECIFIC TESTS**
All dressage tests must be ridden in a 20 x 60 m arena at all championship competitions. For para dressage tests see arena size found in ART E 3.0 (chart)
- **ARTICLE E 9.4.15 ELIMINATION FROM A CLASS - Outside Assistance Space around the Competiton Arena**
Any outside coaching assistance by voice, signs or equipment (earphone and, or electronic communication devices etc), from the moment the riders enters the spacaе around the arena until the test has concluded, is considered unauthorized outside assistance to a rider and will result in elimination.
- **ARTICLE E 9.4.17 Foaming substance**
It is strictly forbidden to use any type of substance/product inside or around the horse's mouth and, or tongue that may:
 - a. imitate, induce or cause foaming; and, or
 - b. coat or otherwise cover or partially cover the bitSee ART A 517.



GENERAL RULES

1. Every class offered is covered by the rules and specifications of the 2025 EC rules and will be held and judged in accordance with these rules: **General Rules** and **Dressage & Para Dressage Rules**.
2. All entries are accepted with the understanding that the Show Committees has the final authority over all scheduling, class conditions, and ground rules. While EC rules strictly apply, Management reserves the right to decide any local questions, governing conditions, or disputes that may arise during the competition.
3. Judges' and Stewards' decisions are final.
4. Neither London Dressage Association, the Ottawa Area Dressage Group, the show committees, Ontario Dressage nor the facilities (Andromeda Equestrian Centre and Westar Farms) will be held responsible for any damage, injury or loss to persons, animals, vehicles, trailers or other property of exhibitors or spectators.
5. From the moment the horse arrives on the show grounds, all EC rules and regulations apply.
6. In accordance with Dressage Rule E7.1.3, Championship awards will be offered in junior, amateur and open categories as well, E.7.11, all levels/divisions will be included and include relevant freestyles.
7. A current valid Horse Recording number must be provided with the entry before competition numbers will be issued and the horse is allowed to compete.
8. Competition numbers must be worn at all times that the horse is out of its stall or trailer.
9. No one other than the competing rider may school the horse from the moment it arrives on the show grounds to the end of the last class ridden.
10. All athletes, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location. *Note: At the tack check which follows the test, the steward may ask the rider to dismount so that the helmet may be inspected for the above approved standards. Article E 4.0*
11. Equestrian Canada has clarified "we have agreed to provide the Silver Championships full exception to the rule ART E 3.11.9 Maximum Number of Levels/Tests/Classes Per Horse Per Day for the 2026 season ONLY". Questions? Please contact the Chair of Ontario Dressage chair@ontariodressage.ca
12. Horses may compete with two different riders at two consecutive levels if each horse/rider combination has qualified at the appropriate level (*Intro, Training, 1st & 2nd Level only*).
13. Horse/Rider combinations may compete at two consecutive levels but in only one freestyle level.
14. All riders must report to the Steward immediately following their tests for a tack check. Failing to report will result in elimination from that class. Article E. 4.15.1
15. Any horse on the show grounds is subject to random drug testing. Failure to comply will result in elimination from competition and disciplinary action from EC.
16. All freestyle music must be provided via email prior to the show. Only digital copies are accepted and must be provided electronically.
17. Stabling is to be arranged as per each division's instructions. See pages 11 & 12. No stabling refunds will be provided after the show closing date under any circumstances.



ONTARIO DRESSAGE

QUALIFYING CRITERIA / ELIGIBILITY

1. To qualify for the Silver Dressage Championships, a horse/rider combination must compete in a minimum of two competitions (1 day or multiple days) and earn two scores of 55% or higher at two different competition days (from the same or different judges) at each level to be entered (including FEI).

Examples of ways to qualify:

- Ride at two 1 day competitions – rider competes in 2 classes at each competition = 4 scores
Scores from first competition are 56% & 58%
Scores from second competition are 63% and 57%
Rider would qualify with 58% from competition 1 and 63% from competition 2.
- Ride at 2 multiday competitions – rider competes in 3 classes at each competition on three different days = 6 scores
Scores from first competition are 54%, 50%, 57%
Scores from the second competition are 60%, 62% & 56%
Rider would qualify with 62% and 60% from the 2nd Competition as well as having competed in the 1st Competition (2 Competition ruling).

The Rider would not qualify if they only competed in the 2nd Competition.

- Ride at 1 single day competition and at 1 multiday competition – rider competes in 3 classes at the single day competition and the rider competes in 5 classes on three different days at the multiday competition = 7 scores.
Scores from the single day competition are 65%, 63% & 66%
Scores from multiday competition are 58%, 60%, 64%, 63%, 64%

The Rider would qualify with 66% from the single day competition and 64% from the multiday competition.

The Rider could also qualify if they wanted to use the scores from the multiday competition fulfilling the 2-competition ruling.

****The Rider would not qualify if they only competed in the multiday competition and not another competition.****

2. Shows/Competitions definition – a show or competition may run 1 day or multiple days and be a sanctioned event with Equestrian Canada.
3. Both riders and owners must be members in good standing with PSO and hold an EC Silver Sport License or higher.
4. All horses must have a current EC Horse Recording.
5. To qualify for the Silver Dressage Championship Freestyle classes, a horse/rider combination must have competed in a minimum of two Silver competitions and earned two scores of 55% or higher in freestyle classes at different competitions (from the same or different judges) at each level (including FEI).



QUALIFYING CRITERIA / ELIGIBILITY CONTINUED

6. In the event that class sizes must be limited, classes will be filled in descending order of the total of the technical qualifying scores submitted.
7. In the event that there are insufficient entries received, additional entries will be accepted (first come, first served) provided the horse/rider combination has competed in two Silver competitions at each level to be entered and has attained scores of 55% or above.
8. In Introductory, Training & First Level, horses may compete with two different riders at two consecutive levels if each horse/rider combination has qualified at the appropriate level.
9. Horse/Rider combinations may compete at two consecutive levels but in only one freestyle level. However, the horse must not extend the number of tests allowed in a day.
10. No substitute riders or horses are allowed. Unless both horse and rider have qualified.
11. No Hors Concours entries will be accepted.

AWARDS/RESULTS

- Awards are based solely on the results of the Division classes. See Article E.9.9, Scores and Placing (page 77 of the EC Rule Book) as it pertains to single entry scores.
- At all EC Championships competitions, any horse receiving less than 50% on a technical test will not be eligible for any class awards/ribbons, Championships or Reserve Championships.
- Class ribbons will be awarded to 8th place. Prizes will be awarded to those who place in accordance with sponsorship received.
- Should there be two judges for a class, the class score shall be the average of the two scores obtained from the judges.
- If there is a protest, it must be made in writing to the Show Secretary within 48 hours of the completion of the class concerned. A \$125 cash deposit must accompany the protest and will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained (EC A1204).
- Details on presentation of awards will be posted on the day of the show. If presentations are mounted, horse and rider must be dressed appropriately and competitive numbers must be visible. For unmounted presentations, riders must be dressed appropriately. Non-compliance may result in forfeiture of any and all ribbons, awards and prizes for the class.
- Championships will be awarded at each level (Introductory through FEI) in Open, Junior and Amateur Categories (except where indicated). Championships are determined by the total percentage of the two technical tests. The competitor with the highest total shall be declared the champion of his/her level and category (e.g.: Training Level, Junior, etc.) and the competitor with the second highest total shall be declared the reserve champion.
- Freestyle Championships will be awarded at each level (Training Level - FEI Medium Tour) as an Open division only. Champions are determined by the totalling the higher percentage from the two technical classes plus the percentage from the freestyle.
- The rider obtaining the highest score of the day will be awarded a special high score ribbon.



ONTARIO DRESSAGE TEAM COMPETITION

Ontario Dressage is pleased to announce that the 2026 Silver Dressage Championships will host a Team Competition.

With a view to encouraging more participation, Ontario Dressage members who compete as individuals at either division of the Silver Dressage Championships are invited to form "teams" and compete together for ribbons and/or product prizes and prize money (all contingent upon the acquisition of the same).

1st Place - \$100/team member, 2nd Place - \$75/Team member, 3rd Place - \$50/Team member

Rules governing this Team Competition are as follows:

- All riders of all teams **must be** members of Ontario Dressage (as of July 1, 2026).
- No additional entry fees are required to enter teams.
- There is no limit to the number of teams that can be fielded by any one Ontario Dressage group and/or individuals at either division.
- All horses and riders may join only one team. A rider may join only one team within his/her division (Eastern/Western).
- All team riders must compete in their relevant technical classes.
- It is recommended that each team identify itself when making entries for the Silver Dressage Championships; however, teams can also be formed and identified at the Championships before the competition begins.
- Each team will consist of three horse/rider combinations.
- All teams entered **MUST** provide a team name.
- Any changes to a team (once identified) must be communicated to the respective divisional Show Secretary ASAP (before competition commences).
- The individual technical scores of each of the three team members will be added together to determine team placing. Freestyles are not part of the Team competition.
- Prize money, awards, etc. will be presented at the subsequent Ontario Dressage Annual General Meeting/Awards banquet (or other event) to all members of those teams that finish 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each Division.
- All riders of the First place teams, East and West, will be listed on the Ontario Dressage Roster of Riders with their team name.

ONTARIO DRESSAGE CHAMPIONSHIP CHALLENGE

The Championship Challenge is another opportunity for Ontario Dressage members to earn cash awards while participating at Championships.

Ontario Dressage members must have earned 3 scores of 60% or higher at 3 different competitions prior to Championships.

At Championships, both technical tests must also be 60% or higher.

All scores are totalled together to determine the winner of the Level, with one Challenge winner per Level (JR, AA & Open combined). Each winner is awarded \$100.



OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Show Secretaries will have the Emergency plans with all relevant phone numbers. They will also have the contact information for the On Call Veterinary and Farrier Services.

First Aid services will be available on site at both divisions through contracted paramedical representatives. If there is an Emergency please contact the Show Organizer so that we can ensure access and care is provided as required.

Warmup Ring Etiquette - we ask everyone to be courteous to others in the ring and pass left to left where possible.

At Westar, the warm-up is divided into sides. The side closest to the West Ring is designated for the West Ring and the one closest to the stabling is designated for the East Ring.

At Andromeda, the warm-up ring is the middle of the 2 competition arenas.

Competitors, officials and competition organizer must observe the Equestrian Canada Horse Welfare Code of Conduct, Competition Administration Policy and the Guidelines for Equine Competition And Training During Extreme Environmental Conditions with respect to but not limited to temperature, heat index and air quality.

National Dressage Pony Cup High Point Champion & Reserve Champion will be awarded to ponies & small horses competing at both Divisions of the Championships. The ribbons have been graciously sponsored and there is no extra cost to the competitors riding ponies or small horses.

According to A213.2, parents and guardians must sign the entry form of a minor child/junior competitor; parents/guardians do not have to be EC Sport License holders. *Note: the horse owner must hold a valid EC Sport License.*

- ii Payment will be made online in accordance with each show directive.
- iii Incomplete entries will not be accepted by Compete Easy, therefore, please ensure that you fill out all fields and attach all required documents.
- iv Competitors on the EC Not in Good Standing List or the EC Medical Suspension List (Article 101 Section A, General Regulations) will be refused entries to the championships.
- v Entries for the show will be processed in order that they are received. The organizing committee reserves the right to limit or refuse entries subject to championships rules limiting a competitor's right to refuse entries A805.
- vi Competitors may enter either the Eastern Division or the Western Division, but not both.
- vii Competitors **may not** enter a freestyle class without entering the technical test classes at the same level and in the same division.

CHAMPIONSHIP BIOSECURITY

In order to keep you and your horse(s) safe at the competitions please observe the following:

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must meet the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.

Please ensure that you have copies of vaccinations (& *Coggins if required*) with you on the day of championships just in case you are asked to provide them.

In making an entry at this show, each owner/trainer attests that, to their best of their knowledge, competing horse(s) under their care have not been in contact with any other horses (away or at their home facility) exhibiting symptoms or signs of illness within the last 14 days. They also agree to share knowledge of any sick or horse displaying symptoms of illness to show management immediately admin@londondressage.com or b.westar@gmail.com.

As well:

- Stall Labels must be completed for each horse, including the horse name and 24- hour emergency contact information, and place on the horse's stall door.
- You must check your horse's temperature twice a day and record it on the Horse Temperature Chart. A normal horse temperature is between 37.2-38.3 C. Any temperature over 38.8 C (102 F) must be reported to the horse show office and/or horse show veterinarian.
- Do not share feed/water containers or buckets between horses and do not use communal water troughs. While filling a bucket, do not let the hose end touch the bucket or the water in a bucket.
- Sharing tack and equipment puts horses at risk and is not recommended. If tack/equipment must be used by multiple horses, be sure to clean/disinfect it between uses by different horses.
- Observe good hygiene around all horses on the grounds, and especially after handling a teammate's horse prior to touching your horse.
- Wash hands immediately with soap and water, or use disinfectant hand solution after handling horses, especially after contact with the mouth, nose or feces.
- Please use hand sanitizers and indicate the importance of their use to your friends, family and casual visitors.
- All stalls have been cleaned of all manure and bedding. Feel free to sanitize your assigned stall prior to bringing your horse in.
- Do not allow nose-to-nose contact between horses.
- Do not permit your horse to lick or sniff surfaces in common areas. If this does occur, please use a disinfectant wipe on the area.
- If sharing a wheelbarrow, please do not bring it into your horse's stall. Leave it in the aisle.
- Please dispose of manure in designated areas only. Do not put trash in manure pile.
- If your horse develops a fever or signs of illness, contact the show veterinarian or steward immediately.
- Following the competition, it is recommended that all horses be isolated at their home facility for 21 days prior to reintroduction to other horses. If this is not possible, be sure to observe all horses carefully for 21 days.
- Following the competition, all horses should have temperatures taken twice a day for four days, and be observed for abnormal behavior and signs of cough, nasal discharge, discomfort or lameness.

EC SPORT LICENSING 2026

SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REMINDER—2026 SEASON

- Coaches attending EC-Sanctioned competition must hold a valid Licensed Coach Status. Any Coach with Registered Coach Status must purchase a Single Event Upgrade for \$55.00. This purchase can be made through the My EC account.
- Coaches without a valid Licensed Coach Status or Registered Coach Status with Single Event Upgrade Status are not eligible to be represented as a coach at EC-Sanctioned events and may be subject to fines. Please complete your requirements in advance to avoid any fines and delays.

DECLARE YOURSELF A SELF-COACHED ATHLETE

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by entering their own **EC SPORT LICENSE NUMBER** or enter "self-coached" in the **COACH FIELD** on their registration/entry form.
- Please note: Coaches that **DO NOT ATTEND** the events **SHOULD NOT BE LISTED** on the entry form.

“ When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. ”
